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How University of Hebron (UHB) works.

At University of Hebron (UHB), you will be part of one or more departments, depending on the programme you're studying. You will be a member of a community of students through university student's union and the whole university family.

When you receive and accept the admission letter for a place at University of Hebron, you will abide to the culture of the institution for the greater good of your career. Courses

Postgraduate courses contain Graduate exams and Electives which are both compulsory for student to select and submit for review. As part of bringing in practical aspect in various programmes, UHB will collaborate with experts in the industry to set up case study examinations as a way of adding value and this forms part of on-going assessment. This exam is tackled at the end of completing postgraduate course work. For the Electives, students select one elective course for assessment and a corresponding exam is formed by internal tutors. These are written at the end of every semester and are part of student assessment.

The programmes are tailored to help students achieve their golden goals and become the desired profession of choice.

The university and its team of consultants design and develops programs in line with the industry's demand and programmes that equip and empowers students with relevant skills to achieve their career goals.

Assessment

University of Hebron (UHB) programmes are administered in two levels; There are assignments in progress and examinations at the end of the semester. The ongoing assessment contributes 40% of the final examination while the final exams contributes 60% of the exams for the undergraduates. In addition, the undergraduate will also submit a research project. As for the graduate level the final examination contributes 50% while dissertation or thesis contributes 50% of the final exam. Both at under graduate and postgraduate students will have to defend the research projects.


